- Maintained financially sustainable through the COVID-19 pandemic the generosity of individuals, businesses, foundations and grants.
- Hosted COVID-19 safe events including our Duck Race & Sunset Yoga.
- Partnered with Trinity Lutheran Church to provide virtually learning support programs. Our program was able to be open from 7:30am-5:00pm and we provided academic support for virutal learning, lunch and an afternoon of enrichment activities.

ABOUT OUR ORGANIZATION



Badgerland After School Enrichment Program (BASE) is a locally operated non-profit organization in Fort Atkinson, WI. BASE formerly the Boys & Girls Clubs of Fort Atkinson was established in 2005 to provide the children of Fort Atkinson a positive place to go after school. BASE programs help young people find positive alternatives to negative influences, especially during the critical after school hours from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

BASE currently serves kids who attend Purdy, Luther, Rockwell and Barrie Elementary School and are at least 7 years old. We have after school programs and a full summer wrap around program. With the help of our community, we are able to keep our programs accessible and affordable to all kids.








FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS MELISSA WILLKOMM

In 2020 our BASE Site Coordinators and Youth Support Specialists demonstrated their ongoing commitment to our mission of inspiring our local youth by providing safe and supportive environments and relationships as well as enriching programs and activities. Changes were made to ensure even safer and healthier operations and to champion the efforts of kids who were facing new opportunities and challenges. With support from our BASE families and our community, we continued to connect with kids by smiling through our masks and with our hearts. I am so happy and grateful for the opportunity to continue to guide the staff and kids in new directions together moving forward.

Here are a few highlights from our programs in 2020:

- Our Lend A Hand Community Service Program focused efforts on our 8th Annual Penny Drive, beginning in February and finishing up in July, raising \$627.00 for the Wildlife Warriors Australia Zoo to help the animals hurt in the Australian Bushfires. We also made and donated ornaments for the Fort Atkinson Riverwalk Plaza Holiday tree for the second year in a row.
- We updated our BASE Fort Atkinson webpage with 6 BASE Staff Shares program blog posts, Mystery Reader video stream sessions, the BASE Stay Connected & Stay Healthy COVID-19 Resource Guides volumes #1-25, BASE Online Art Show, and our BASE Kids Lab pages.
- Together as a team we implemented newly developed programs including the BASE Virtual After School Hangouts, BASE Summer 2020 Afternoon Hangouts at the Park, BASE Summer 2020 Program at Luther, and the BASE Virtual Learning Support Program at Trinity.
- We expanded our BASE staff development and training webpage with a variety of resources and webinars for staff members to explore, learn, connect with other out of school time professionals, and have fun.

OUR PROGRAMS

BASE offers after school and summer programs to children who are at least 7 years old. Program activities include topics like art, diversity and foreign language, physical fitness, technology, science and community service.

Our 4 priority outcomes are:



CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT

Programs support youth in developing and sustaining meaningful relationships with others, identifying personal strengths and building self-reliance, developing a positive self-image, practicing mindfulness and problem-solving techniques, respecting their own and others' cultural identities, working with others and developing teamwork skills, and understanding philanthropy and the rewards of giving to others and the community.

ENRICHMENT & LEARNING

Programs develop youth creativity and cultural awareness, give youth the skills necessary to become proficient in basic educational disciplines and embrace technology to achieve success in a career. Through participation in homework help, computer tech classes, art, science and math achievement programs, members become more confident in their pursuit of academic achievement.





WELLNESS

Programs develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors that nurture their own well-being, set personal goals and live successfully as self-sufficient adults. Activities include nutrition, cooking/baking, mindfulness, outdoor and indoor fitness activities, and field trips.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Programs empower youth to support and influence BASE and the community in positive ways. The youth learn about community resources and opportunities as well as social issue areas. They are encouraged to identify their skills and talents that can be shared to make a difference or benefit organizations and the community. Activities include leadership programs, character building experiences and community service projects.



10 FACTS ABOUT BASE

- 1. BASE is open from 3-6pm, Monday through Friday on all student contact days of the Fort Atkinson School District.
- 2 .BASE is also open on Early Release Days and select No School Days.
- 3. BASE uses space donated from the School District of Fort Atkinson to run all of our youth programming.
- 4. BASE employs 15-20 part time Site Coordinators and Youth Support Specialists to work with kids, plan & implement quality programs and to be supportive role models.
- 5. BASE Kids participate 15 minutes of reading and 30 minutes of homework, Monday through Thursday.
- 6. BASE kids participate in 45-60 minutes of recreation time outside or in the gym EVERYDAY!
- 7. BASE has 5 weekly program areas which include: The Arts, Creative Writing, STEM, Academics/Trivia/Chit Chat, and Friday Fun Day.
- 8. BASE also hosts activities that focus on community service, science, cooking and more!
- 9. BASE implements virtual and in person programs throughout the school year and summer.
- 10. BASE works to Inspire Kids and Build Bright Futures in Fort Atkinson.


